

ANTHONY TOWNSHIP SUPERVISORS

Regular Monthly Meeting
Wednesday October 6, 2021

The meeting was called to order by Richard R. Hess, Chair, at 7:00 P.M. In attendance were Supervisors Richard R. Hess, Dennis Sheatler and Gary Fogelman. Roadmaster Frank Rishel and 12 visitors.

Pledge to flag and remain Standing for Prayer.

All motions are approved unanimously unless otherwise noted.

Richard Hess made a motion to approve the minutes of the September 1, 2021 monthly meeting. Second Dennis Sheatler. Richard Hess asked for any comments or questions. There being none, vote was taken.

Richard Hess made a motion to approve the Treasurer's report for September. Second Dennis Sheatler. Richard Hess asked for any comments or questions. There being none, vote was taken.

Richard Hess made a motion to approve payment of the bills for October 2021. Second Gary Fogelman. Richard Hess asked for any comments or questions. There being none, vote was taken.

Richard Hess made a motion to approve the work session minutes of September 28, 2021 meeting. Second Dennis Sheatler. Richard Hess asked if there were any questions or comments. There being none, vote was taken.

Old Business:

Penny Rishel read the zoning report to the audience. There were 3 approved zoning permits for a total of \$635.00 for the month of September.

Penny reported that Central Keystone COG sent a report for September 2021—2 permits were issued.

Roadmaster Frank Rishel presented a report, which was made available to all those in attendance, on the roadwork done in September.

Frank Rishel reported on an update on the Larson Road Grant Project. Pipes have been replaced and the other work is underway. Work should be completed by the end of October.

No one will be attending the PSATS business meeting on Friday October 15, 2021 in Hershey. The resolutions that will be voted on were reviewed and the township is in agreement with PSATS as to the voting of these proposed resolutions

New Business:

Discussed whether to publish a newsletter for the fall. Penny said that because of not having a Community Christmas Dinner as a result of finances, volunteers and possible covid restrictions coming; she suggested waiting until spring to publish another one. The township would be saving approximately \$500.

Richard Hess discussed the need for a logging permit for any property who is logging more than an acre. A permit can be acquired through Greg Molter, Zoning Officer in Danville.

Some questions were asked from residents if a permit is needed for solar panel installation on private properties. Richard Hess reported that anyone planning to install solar panels on their private property must apply for a Zoning as well as a Building Permit.

Richard Hess spoke with Marc Jackson of Talen Energy about the future of coal at the plant. He said that if Talen does not convert the plant to gas by 2025 it will discontinue using coal. The cost to switch to gas is approximately \$100 million.

Public Comment: Richard Hess asked for any public comment. Leonard Parker asked about permits on properties. He was directed to contact Greg Molter with any questions. Stan Boler asked about acquiring a

copy of the Amendment to the Zoning Ordinance and he suggested having it available on the website. Penny will scan it and put it on the website.

There being no other official business to conduct, Dennis Sheatler made a motion to adjourn. Second Gary Fogelman.
